Substance abuse is a behavior that detracts from our ability "To Fight! To Fight Well!" and distracts from our top priority of supporting II Marine Expeditionary Force and 2D Marine Aircraft Wing's combat power and readiness.

My policy is simple – ZERO TOLERANCE

Marines, Sailors, and Civilians assigned to MCAS New River are expected to hold the highest standards of conduct, discipline, and readiness. Substance abuse – whether involving illegal drugs, the misuse of prescription medications, or excessive use of alcohol – undermines our mission, endangers lives, and damages the trust placed in us by the American people.

Let me be absolutely clear: Any individual determined to be abusing substances will face immediate administrative and/or legal action.

Our mission demands peak performance. Substance abuse is incompatible with service. I expect leaders at every level to be vigilant, engaged, and proactive – not only in identifying and addressing abuse, but in reinforcing a culture of responsibility, support, and strength.

We are entrusted with great responsibility. Let's stay sharp, stay ready, lead by example and Fight Well!
